Stop and Jot

When you come across a good idea or a question occurs to you, get in the habit of stopping to jot it down. You don't need to go into detail at this point.

This is important for keeping track of where you found the idea so that you can find it again when you want to. In addition, when you are further along in your inquiry, you can use this to cite the source that you used.
